Best Practice Approval Sheet

Painting and Staining

NOTE: All descriptions are based on visibility from > 2'



Initial Stage Prep and Prime

- o Materials are delivered and neatly organized at job site
- O Jobsite is completely partitioned, swept, and vacuumed (including floor, trim, vents, outlets, cabinets, etc.)
- o Trim has been caulked, filled and sanded to conceal holes and defects
- o Walls have been filled and sanded between coats
- O Hardware has been removed, bagged and labeled; doors are labeled on top edge
- *Remodel ONLY: "dime-sized" or smaller defects are filled/sanded to concealment
- o For stain ONLY: wood conditioner is used before staining
- o For stain ONLY: panels have been sanded, and holes puttied
- o Field Worker Policy is being followed

Substantial Completion Stage

- o Trim and other millwork/cabinetry is painted evenly and free of "curtains" or drips
- o Walls have been rolled evenly and free of "curtains", drips, roller marks, or light spots
- o Cut-in lines between trim, walls, ceilings and different finishes are straight
- o Ceiling is rolled evenly and free of rollermarks or sheen changes
- o Extra paint has been labeled clearly with marker and stored in appropriate area on jobsite

Final Stage

- o All work has been completed
- o Client Walkthrough has passed
- o All related change orders have been resolved
- o Extra product and materials have been removed from site

General Requirements

- o Work was completed on time
- o Daily check-in/out was conducted through Service Coordinator
- O Workspace was <u>rolled up</u> and swept clean daily
- o We have current certificate of insurance (with worker's comp and liability) on file

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
